### General Instructions for the Contributors

*Indian Journal of History of Science* publishes original research papers on History of Science, technology, concepts including translation and critical assessment of original technical sources. The papers are published on the understanding that they are not offered elsewhere for publication. Neatly typed manuscripts in duplicate are to be submitted to the Editor, Indian Journal of History of Science, Indian National Science Academy, Bahadur Shah Zafar Marg, New Delhi 110002. The authors are encouraged to submit the manuscript in a CD or by mail at [ijhs@insa.nic.in](mailto:ijhs@insa.nic.in). For the purpose of review of books, two copies may be sent to the above address.

Manuscripts are to be typed on one side of the paper in double spacing with wide margins. The title page should contain the title of the paper, name and address of the author (s) and a short abstract of the paper not exceeding 250 words, along with a list of key words.

References, with full bibliographical details, must be given separately at the end, indicating their location in the text by sequentially running superior numbers. All the bibliographical information should be provided in the first citation; in the subsequent citations op. cit. may be used. Examples:

- (i) References to books: T. A. Saraswati Amma, *Geometry in Ancient and Medieval India*, Motilal Banarsidass, Delhi 1979, pp. 14-60.
- (ii) Reference to texts classical languages: Śridharācārya, *Pāṭiḡaṇita* with an ancient Sanskrit commentary, ed & tr, Kripa Sankar Shukla, Department of Mathematics and Astronomy, Lucknow University, Lucknow, 1959.
- (iii) References to articles published in journals: David King, "The Origin of the Astrolabe according to Medieval Islamic Source," *Journal for the History of Arabic Sciences*, 5( 1981) 43-83. For the *Indian Journal of History of Science*, use the abbreviation *IJHS*. For other Journals, give the full titles.
- (iv) References to articles published in volumes: K.V. Sarma, "Source Materials on Indian Mathematics and Astronomy " in B.V. Subbarayappa & S.R.N. Mutthy (ed), *Scientific Heritage of India: Proceeding of a National Seminar*, September 19-21, 1986, The Mythic Society, Bangalore, 1988, pp. 1-9.

Diacritical marks should be used where necessary. Acknowledgements are to be placed at the end of the paper.

Line drawings should be made with India ink on white board or tracing paper. Photographs should be glossy with strong contrast. The contributors are encouraged to send colored photographs wherever possible.

Author(s) will get twenty off-prints free. Contributors to the Supplementary Section are entitled to receive five free bound copies of their manuscript after publication of the complete manuscript.
